



“SILVER ALERT”

MOZELLE SENIOR OR VULNERABLE ADULT MEDICAL ALERT ACT

On June 19, 2012 the Governor signed the “Silver Alert” into law. Similar to the “Amber Alert,” law enforcement must take a report regarding a missing person as soon as they are notified. The report is then forwarded to all law enforcement agencies with jurisdiction in the area. A copy is also sent to “one or more broadcasters that broadcast in an area where the missing senior may be located.”
