EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The Department of Technology, Management and Budget, in accordance with Section 221 of Public Act 107 of 2017, has prepared this Policy Changes to Implement 2017 Public Acts report. The Act states:

“Sec. 221. Each department and agency shall report no later than April 1 on each specific policy change made to implement a public act affecting the department that took effect during the prior calendar year to the senate and house of representatives standing committees on appropriations subcommittees on general government, the joint committee on administrative rules, and the senate and house fiscal agencies.”

With the exception of appropriations bills, six acts impacting department activities became law in calendar year 2017. Following enactment, the Department made policy changes or took other actions to implement those acts where necessary. The following chart lists the changes made to implement each act as of March 31, 2018.

21	SB 69	State financing and management; other; disclosure of certain information in the procurement process. Amends section 261 of PA 431 of 1984, the Management and Budget Act.	DTMB modified the proposal instructions within the purchasing documents utilized for state procurement to meet the requirement of the Act. DTMB procurement has also updated internal procedures for FOIA coordinator in accordance with the changes made in the Act.
26	SB 119	AN ACT to require the state administrative board to convey state-owned property in Marquette County; to prescribe conditions for the conveyance; to provide for powers and duties of state departments, agencies, and officers in regard to the property; and to provide for disposition of revenue derived from the conveyance.	Property was conveyed in September 2017 to Northern Michigan University.
43	HB 4131	Retirement; other; forfeiture of employer contributions to a defined contribution plan if public employee is convicted of certain felonies. Amends sections 2, 3 and 4 of PA 350 of 1994, the Public Employee Retirement Benefits Forfeiture Act.	The Act codified what was already the Office of Retirement Services' interpretation of the forfeiture act as it pertains to defined contribution balances. The Act has been implemented in full.
106	HB 4759	AN ACT to authorize the department of technology, management, and budget to convey parcels of state-owned property in Ingham County; to provide for powers and duties of state departments, agencies, and officers and branches of state government in regard to the property; and to provide for disposition of revenue derived from the conveyances.	An RFP was issued for the property, property tours for interested buyers have been performed and proposals are due by May 15, 2018.
132	HB 4508	AN ACT to create a program under which volunteers may provide services to organizations in this state to respond to cybersecurity incidents; to provide for protection from liability for personal injury and property damage; to provide for the powers and duties of state governmental officers and agencies; and to create the Michigan cyber civilian corps advisory board and prescribe its powers and duties.	Established guidelines for individuals to become volunteers and related deployment procedures. Currently vetting applications and planning criminal background checks of individuals interested in becoming members of Michigan cyber civilian corps.
92	SB 401	Retirement; public school employees; default defined contribution only for employees hired after certain date; require and provide for other general amendments. Amends sections 5, 41, 41b, 42, 43a, 69, 69c, 69f, 70, 71, 75, 81c, 81d, 108, 127, 131, and 131a of PA 300 of 1980, the Public Schools Employee Retirement Act of 1979.	The Office of Retirement Services has eliminated the necessary credit service purchases, has introduced the 4% employer mandatory contribution, has implemented the employer normal cost and Unfunded Actuarial Accrued Liability floor, has introduced the new defined contribution matching paradigm and Pension Plus II plan, and has created an implementation plan for the current operating expenditure growth rate for payroll base.
