

<b>33 CLUES OF INTOXICATION</b>
---------------------------------

Section 801 (2) of the Michigan Liquor Control Code, Administrative Rules and Related Laws states that “A retail licensee shall not directly or indirectly, individually or by a clerk, agent, or servant sell, furnish, or give alcoholic liquor to a person who is visibly intoxicated”. It is also a violation of Section 707 (3) “A licensee, or the clerk, servant, agent, or employee of a licensee shall not be in an intoxicated condition on the licensed premises”.

Aggressive or Belligerent	Difficulty standing up or walking	Ordering doubles
Annoying other; patrons or servers	Disheveled clothing or mussed hair	Overly friendly to other patrons and employees
Argumentative	Drinking alone	Paying for strangers drinks
Bloodshot; glassy eyes	Drinking too fast	Radical changes in behavior or voice level
Boisterous	Drowsy	Slow response to questions
Bumping into things	Entering the wrong gender’s bathroom	Slurred speech
Careless with money	Letting a cigarette burn without smoking it	Spilling drinks, clumsy
Complaining about drink prices or drink strength	Lighting more than one cigarette or lighting the wrong end	Swaying, staggering
Depressed, sullen, crying or moody	Loud speech	Unable to focus eyes or read nearby signs
Difficulty handling money or picking up change	Making inappropriate comments	Unable to sit straight in chair or bar stool
Difficulty remembering	Obnoxious or mean	Urging other people to have another drink
