

## **Out-of-State Exhibitors of Swine**

1. Swine imported into Michigan for exhibition shall be accompanied by an official interstate health certificate or official certificate of veterinary inspection prepared by an accredited veterinarian from the state of origin and must have official identification.
2. Importation of swine vaccinated against pseudorabies is prohibited.
3. A person shall not bring swine into this state from auction sales or other collection facilities where slaughter swine are handled.
4. A person shall not import or release live feral swine or any crosses of feral swine.
5. Breeding swine brought into Michigan shall originate from a herd located in a brucellosis and pseudorabies free state.
6. Post entry pseudorabies virus test requirements for breeding swine are required if the swine are sold from a fair, exhibition, exposition or show to a Michigan buyer.
7. Breeding swine purchased by a Michigan buyer from a fair, exhibition, exposition or show authority shall remain on the premises of the buyer until the buyer obtains an official test negative for pseudorabies conducted not less than thirty (30) or more than sixty (60) days following the date of importation.
8. "Breeding swine" means swine intended for use as breeding stock and all swine not intended for slaughter or feeding to market age and weight for slaughter including companion animals and research animals regardless of reproductive capacity. Breeding swine includes all boars and sows.
