| Last week, OHSP conducted a NHTSA Alcohol Assessment. The priority recommendations were discussed. The final report will be made available to all team members. |

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| Agency Updates: |
| Katy Gonzales: Work has been ongoing comparing death certificate data to FARS data for motor vehicle traffic crash deaths. The report shows that from 2007-2011, only 3% of MVTC deaths among Michigan residents are alcohol-involved (there are 17 related causes of death that can be listed on the death certificate and a search was conducted within those for an alcohol-related condition, like excessive blood level of alcohol) compared to 25% of FARS alcohol-involved MVTC deaths (alcohol-involved=decedents that had a BAC test given and had a positive BAC value in the numerator). Obviously, there is a large gap between what is happening in the real world and what is being recorded on death certificates. |
| Ken Stecker: upcoming trainings include "Cops in Court" and "Lethal Weapon" and a training for new prosecutors and interns. |

Mike Harris: Michigan now has 71 DREs after the graduation of 22 new DREs in March. Four new prosecutors also attended the training, bringing the number of DRE-trained prosecutors to 17. Michigan is the only state that has DRE-trained prosecutors. Mike also discussed that the demand for ARIDE training is increasing and the priority is for law enforcement to attend the training first. The DRE Steering Committee is looking into tailoring the training for probation officers, educators and other professions that would benefit from the training.

Keitha Cameron: MDOS is looking to put some drunk driving materials in the branch offices, including OHSP's "Under 21?" and "Drunk Driving is a Costly Crime" in August. They are also thinking of creating a separate piece for driver's education providers. She also discussed MDOS's support of the Courageous Persuaders program: <http://www.courageouspersuaders.com/>

Lee Ann Gasper: MDOS is starting work on the 2013 Drunk Driving Audit, which will be released by July 1, 2014: www.michigan.gov/drunkdirivingaudit

Mary Rademacher: MDOS is working on legislation and administrative rules to strengthen the state's ignition interlock program, including requiring devices to have cameras.
