



## LAW ENFORCEMENT INFORMATION NETWORK SOS Original Issue Date (OID) Information

This correspondence is being distributed to authorized Law Enforcement Information Network (LEIN) user agencies regarding the addition of Original Issue Date (OID) information to vehicle registration and title responses from the Department of State effective July 6, 2015.

In response to many requests from user agencies, the Michigan Department of State has reconfigured vehicle responses to include the OID of a license plate on both plate and vehicle identification number (VIN) inquiries. The OID will appear on the same line as the electronic insurance verification (EIV) information in plate inquiries using 47:11 (Registration and Title); 47:11C (Certified Registration and Title); 47:13 (Registration only by Plate); 47:14 (Registration – Fees Paid); and VIN inquiries using 47:53 (Registration and Title) and 47:53C (Certified Registration and Title). The OID information appears in bold below:
