

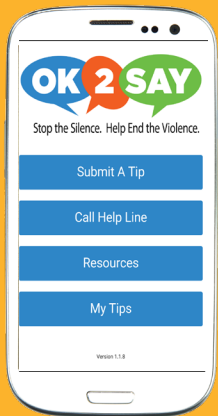
PURPOSE

OK2SAY encourages confidential tips on criminal activities or potential harm directed at students, school employees or schools.

BREAKING THE CULTURE OF SILENCE

A Secret Service study found in 81 percent of violent school incidents, someone other than the attacker had knowledge of the plan, but failed to report it because of fear or retaliation or being labeled a snitch.

To eliminate that fear and help break the code of silence, the tipster's identity is confidential.

4

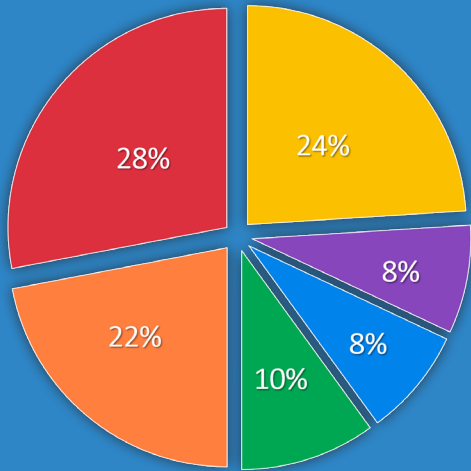
Outcome report completed.

Schools, law enforcement, community mental health, or the Department of Health and Human Services receive and investigate tips.
