

STATEWIDE INFRASTRUCTURE PRIORITIZATION



In his FY 2017 budget recommendation, Governor Rick Snyder calls for the creation of a **Michigan Infrastructure Fund** to be used to fund statewide infrastructure needs. The investment in the FY 2017 budget is the first step in addressing Michigan's infrastructure needs.

THE FIRST STEPS

In 2015, we made a **renewed commitment to our roads and bridges** with the passage of the transportation funding package.



Now it's time to **focus on the rest of Michigan's infrastructure** need based on the recommendations of the announced **Commission on 21st Century Infrastructure**.

Categories for investment could include:

- 1) **Replacement of known high-risk lead and copper service lines** attributed to high lead or copper levels in children, pregnant women, or the drinking water supply.
- 2) Implementation of infrastructure improvements that incentivize **infrastructure upgrades while repairing roads or other utilities** and allow communities to fully leverage federal, state, and local funds.
- 3) **Development of asset management plans** including an inventory and analysis of the current infrastructure and prioritization of needs based on a right sizing of infrastructure in comparison to population
