

**REPORT TO THE LEGISLATURE**  
**Pursuant to P.A. 245 of 2008**  
**Section 403 (7)**  
**Biannual Report on MPRI Mental Health Releases**  
**December 1, 2008 Report**  
**(April 1, 2008 – September 30, 2008 Data)**

*Section 403 (7) of P.A. 245 of 2008* requires that the department provide biannual reports on offenders who participated in the Michigan Prisoner Re-Entry Initiative (MPRI) and have a diagnosis of mental illness or received mental health treatment while in prison, including the number of offenders successfully referred to the local community mental health agency and the number of parolees participating in treatment for mental illness, by county.

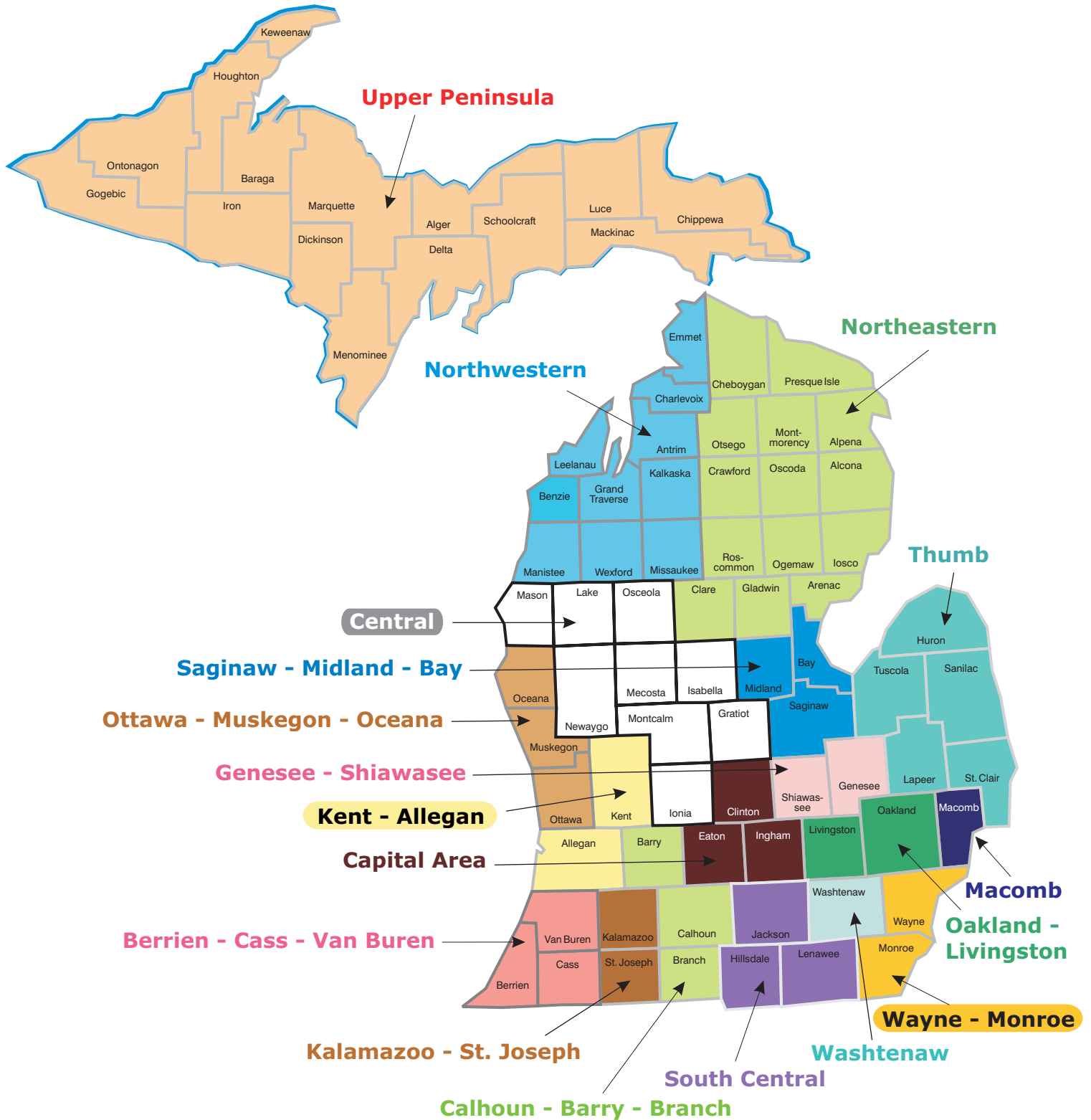
The Department of Corrections does not have access to the local mental health agencies' data systems to independently verify the number of parolees who actively participated in treatment for mental illness in Michigan communities following release, but policy requires referral for mental health evaluation and potential treatment whenever there is either a diagnosis of active mental illness or observed/reported offender behavior indicative of potential mental health concerns.

Many counties have only one MPRI mental health case released, if any at all. Therefore, this report aggregates the counties into the 18 MPRI sites across the state and collapses the entire six-month period into a single data table to ensure the anonymity of individual mental health cases.

On October 1, 2007 the MPRI went statewide. Each of the counties is configured into one of the 18 MPRI sites. **MAP 1** displays the MPRI site county configurations; **Table 1** shows the MPRI sites by county configuration; and **Table 2** shows the allocation of counties into the MPRI sites.

**Table 3** shows the number of MPRI mental health paroles released between April 1, 2008 and September 30, 2008, broken down by the 18 MPRI Sites. The MPRI Mental Health Project actively engages the treatment community in the development of individualized treatment plans and suitable community placements in advance of the parole decisions for mentally ill offenders who are eligible for release, as well as for discharges on the maximum sentence. Offenders with mental illness can get their mental health needs addressed by being referred to the Mental Health Project through the Parole Board or parole agents, or they can receive services through each site's MPRI Transition Team.
