REVIEW AND APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Approval of Minutes for August 20, 2020:

Michele Hodges called the meeting to order and welcomed everyone.

GENERAL UPDATES

Ron Olson, Chief, DNR-PRD

We are working on restart plans for facilities, including the Conservancy, Aquarium. The Michigan Natural Resources Trust Fund fact sheet was forwarded to members. It will be reviewed by the committee to see if support is in order. The events and concession review plan was submitted to the members for their review and input. Once input is gathered, it can be discussed at a future meeting.

Chief Olson recognized **Conservation Officers Robert Watson, Dan Walzak, David Schaumburger, Detroit EMS Medic Jason Cornell, and DNR Ranger Matt Krupansky**, for their life savings efforts on Belle Isle on August 4, 2020, where they pulled an individual out of the water who had driven his car into the Detroit River intentionally. Without their heroic, quick action, the individual would have drowned.

Chair Hodges recognized **Detroit Fire Sergeant, Savid Johnson**, who, while off duty recreating with his daughter on the island, died trying to save two teenagers from drowning in the Detroit River. She asked for a moment of silence in honor of him.

Scott Pratt acknowledged **Captain David Malloch** and **Lieutenant Todd Szyska**, who are on the call. **Lt. Szyska** thanked the BIPAC and **Chief Olson** for recognizing the officers and showing support, especially during these tough times. He said it is great to have partnerships with Detroit Fire, MSP and staff. Cpt. Malloch followed what Lt. Szyska said by saying it was great, top-notch work done by the officers and everyone involved, and he is very proud of everyone. Chair Hodges thanked Cpt. Malloch and Lt. Szyska for their leadership.

Karis Floyd, Park Manager, Belle Isle and Milliken

The restrooms will be winterized soon. Shelter 7 and the Bus Stop will remain open all winter. The Scott Fountain has been winterized as of last Sunday and they are in the process of putting together a manual for running the fountain. The coffer dam is working, and water is down about 16 inches. **Ranger Colton Lange** has moved on to another position as of September 11. Karis thanked Colton for his work. They will be filling his position. Today they will start interviews for a full-time ranger position that is currently vacant. Karis introduced **Darren Swan**, the new

working out of class supervisor, who came from Island Lake Recreation Area. **Chair Hodges** and the committee welcomed **Darren**. Karis thanked former Belle Isle Park supervisor **Jacob Brown**, who was on the ground when the park first opened, for all his work during his tenure as the supervisor. Karis introduced **Ali Sayad** from Hype Athletics. Mr. Sayad said there is a great opportunity to establish partnerships. They have been able to improve the area, cleaning up the weeds, etc. Some of the baseball players have been unable to get on the island due to overcapacity, but other than that, it has been an amazing experience so far and the staff have been great to work with and are very helpful and responsive. He is looking forward to next year and launching some new programs on the island and making it a regional destination. They will launch spring volleyball and soccer fields next year. They will also approach corporate entities to help such as the Detroit Tigers and Detroit Pistons. **Chair Hodges** thanked him for everything they have done and welcomed them to the team.

Amanda Treadwell, PRD Planner, Southeast Michigan

Many of the construction projects are now underway that were paused because of the executive orders. As of last Friday, all DTMB projects have been approved to restart. Currently there are 9 construction projects, 11 engineering projects, and 10 partner agency coordinations that are underway. (See attached Belle Isle Park Infrastructure Update.)

A lot of the impediments to the forest are from infrastructure builds and roads which cut off the flatwoods from the Detroit River. Many of these modifications have impacted the ecosystem. The restoration plan will provide for reestablishing many of the hydration systems through swales and culverts, opening up the flatwoods. More information will come in the future.

Michael Curis commended **Amanda** for running all of these projects and that he appreciates her work. Amanda thanked Karis, the rangers and other folks for working as a team with her to accomplish them.

Chair Hodges acknowledged the questions that came forth on the forest. She noted that both **Ray Fahlsing** and **Heidi Frei** were also on this call. She questioned if the contractors are being managed properly. **Amanda** said there is coordination with DTE. DTE is redoing the entire utility system on the island and there is a certain alignment that must take place. When looking at replacing an entire utility system, unfortunately there will be impacts, such as to the trees. When that was done, DNR did work with DTE on the impact. DTE brought in Davey Tree and provided mitigation for trees that were removed. PRD and DTE are very open to discussing solutions to tree mitigations.

Chair Hodges acknowledged **Jacob Brown**, who moved to the west side of the state to be closer to family. She thanked him for all of his hard work on the island since the very beginning and let him know that he is part of Belle Isle history. She thanked him for being a great professional and an overall “cool person” to be around. She mentioned her memories of him standing proud in his position and his traditional antics at the Garden Party every year. **Jacob** said he is enjoying being on the west side but does miss everyone.

Lt. Todd Szyska, DNR Law Enforcement

It continues to be busy on the island. The COVID memorial was very moving and was performed in a very orderly manner. He thanks **Scott Pratt** for overseeing the details as it went smoothly. His staff spent the remainder of that evening informing citizens who thought they could watch the fireworks there, that the park was closed. Hopefully when the pandemic is over things can go back to normal. As it continues to be busy, they will continue ramping up enforcement on the weekends. There are still issues with ORVs and pit bikes on the island. He appreciates Parks posting signs. **Lance Couturier, MSP**, said operations will move to the south post but they will still be patrolling on an on-call basis.

Belle Isle Conservancy Update, Michele Hodges

The Garden Party event was wonderful; **Jeremy Kemp** was fantastic and made them proud. They had to pivot the program to a virtual setting, and still managed to raise \$20K. She asked Ray Fahlsing to extend their appreciation to the team. Keep Belle Isle Beautiful will have an event this Saturday. They are coordinating Senior Days at the Aquarium in alignment with state regulations. It will not be open to the public. The Giving Society inaugural year will commence this year; an important funding source they will continue to build on and grow. She is excited to report that the Polish the Jewel event will be on October 15 and will be virtual. Attendees will receive a picnic basket. She extends appreciate to **Sommer Woods** who will be hosting the event. They received a grant from EPA for \$300K to support stewardship events on the island. She encourages everyone to see Jefferson Inc.'s master plan which is available on their website. The Dossin is open. Trash Talks will be rescheduled and she will have more information as it is available. The memorial ride was a powerful and important moment for the community, and it attests to the importance of Belle Isle. She was honored to be a part of it. She thanked **Rochelle Riley** for organizing it. The Facebook video of the memorial has received over 3M views. Belle Isle has been there for the community when it has needed it the most.

PUBLIC COMMENT

Robin Heller, Detroit Yacht Club Foundation – She echoes congratulations to **Jacob Brown**, who was an outstanding member of the Belle Isle team. On October 15, the Detroit Yacht Club Foundation will be holding a fundraiser for restoration of the clubhouse. This will be open to the public. Any questions, please see the website. She questioned the intent of the kayak/fishing launch. **Amanda Treadwell** said the launch is intended for non-motorized vessels.

Bud Denker welcomed **Darren Swan** and thanked **Jake Brown** for his service. He also thanked the officers, ranger and Detroit medic for their heroic efforts on August 4. His thoughts and prayers go out to **Sargent Johnson**, one of Detroit Fire Department's best. He thanked **Amanda, Karis, Scott** and the team for being heroes as well and appreciates their efforts.



- **November 2020 - Notice to Proceed for Contractor estimated**
- **December 2020/January 2021 – Mobilize to site. Complete prep. work as possible in winter**
- **March 2021 – Nov/Dec 2021 – Main restoration activities completed – all plants/trees planted**
- **May – October 2022 – Vegetation Establishment Period**






- Vista, Central, Oakway repaving: Through October 16th


