

SAT Suite Question Bank FAQs/Help Topics

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The SAT Suite Question Bank provides educators with access to over 3,500 questions from the SAT, PSAT/NMSQT and PSAT 10, and PSAT 8/9 assessments. The SAT Suite Question Bank is designed to help educators:

- become more familiar with the SAT Suite of Assessments
- better understand the knowledge and skills assessed to inform instruction, and
- access set of questions by subscores, cross-test scores, and content domains.

Q: How do I access the SAT Suite Question Bank?

The SAT Question Bank is available online at satsuitequestionbank.collegeboard.org

Q: Do I need a College Board Educator Account or an access code to access the SAT Suite Question Bank?

A: No. The SAT Suite Question Bank is publicly available at satsuitequestionbank.collegeboard.org. You do not need a College Board account or access code to utilize this resource.

Q: Can I export questions as an .xls or .csv file

A: Not at this time. College Board is working to build out this functionality. Questions can be exported as PDF files.

Q: How many questions are in the SAT Suite Question Bank?

A: There are approximately 3,500 questions from the SAT, PSAT/NMSQT and PSAT 10, and PSAT 8/9 available in the SAT Suite Question Bank.

Q: Will additional questions be added?

A: College Board plans to add more questions to the SAT Suite Question Bank on an annual basis.

Q: When will additional questions be added?

A: The exact timing of when the SAT Suite Question Bank will be updated with additional questions is still to be determined but will likely occur in the late summer or fall on an annual basis.

Q: Can I print questions?

A: Yes, you can print individual questions or sets of questions. Up to 20 questions can be printed at one time.

Q. Can I save my question set searches?

A. Users can export up to 20 questions at a time as a PDF which can be saved and/or printed. There are three formats a user can choose from:

- 1) No correct answers or explanations
- 2) With correct answers and explanations
- 3) Without answers or headers

Q. Why does the PDF of the question reference a set of questions, for example “Question 1-9 are based on the following passage?”

A. There are multiple questions for each passage. The PDF of each Reading and Writing & Language Test question include the number of questions asked for each passage.

Q. Can I see all the questions for a specific passage?

A. No. This functionality is not available in the tool.

Q: How is the SAT Suite Question Bank different than the Questions Analysis Report in the K-12 Reporting Portal?

A: The SAT Suite Question Bank provides access to over 3,500 questions from the SAT, PSAT/NMSQT – PSAT 10 and PSAT 8/9 assessments. Users can search for questions by assessment, test and subscore and/or cross test score. For each question, the following information is provided:

- Level of difficulty
- Primary, secondary and tertiary dimensions
- Passage text complexity level for Reading and Writing & Language questions
- Calculator/no-calculator for Math questions
- Questions, answer choices, answer explanations

The Question Analysis Report provides performance data by question based on the form of the assessment taken. For released forms of an assessment, the question, answer choices, and answer explanations are also provided.

Q. How do I know what each of the subscore and cross-test scores mean?

Q. How do I know what each of the filters (level of difficulty, passage text complexity, calculator/no-calculator and primary dimension) mean?

A. Please click on the “?” for a description of each filter.

Q: Where can I get more information about the primary, secondary and tertiary dimensions?

Q. How is difficulty level determined?

A. There are three levels of difficulty: easy, medium, hard. Each question is assigned a level of difficulty based on student performance. Easy questions were correctly answered more frequently than hard questions.

Q: What does “Passage Text Complexity Grades 13-14” mean?

A: In this case, Grades 13-14 represents introductory college course-level passages.

Q. What is the question ID #?

A. Each question in the SAT Suite Question Bank is assigned a unique question ID number. The same unique question ID number will appear for the question each time it is included in a set of search results. The unique question ID number also appears in the PDF of the question.

Q. Can I filter/search by question ID #?

A. No. This functionality is currently not supported.

Q. How are the questions organized in the results chart?

A. The question result chart is organized by two criteria:

- 1) subscore and/or crosstest score, then
- 2) by level of difficulty

Q. Why are the primary dimensions for Math questions the same as the subscores?

A. This is due to the test specifications and the way items are developed/classified for the assessments. To narrow math search results, users are encouraged to select questions by the secondary dimension and then click on “show selected questions.”

Q. Why didn't my search find any questions?

A. The number of questions that will be displayed is dependent on the search criteria and filters that are applied. In some cases, the criteria and filters will not match any of the questions in the tool. If this occurs, please revise your search criteria and/or filters.

Q. Is it possible to search for paired questions in the Reading test?

A. College Board is working to make it possible for a user to see paired questions. For example, some “Command of Evidence” questions are paired with the answer given to a previous question. Currently, the previous question is not displayed as part of the results.

Q. Can users run a query that will result in all the questions for an assessment being displayed.

A. No. Users must select an assessment, a test, and one or more subscores and/or cross-test scores.

Q. How can I start a new search?

A. Click on the Find Questions button on the upper left-hand corner or the blue “new search” link next to Your Search Criteria.

Q: How can I identify the state standards that are related to each question?

A: In the K-12 Reporting Portal, mappings of each state’s academic standards to the SAT Suite subscores are provided. College Board is working to integrate state academic content standards into the SAT Suite Question Bank.
