

Medical Passports

(FY 2020 Appropriation Act - Public Act 67 of 2019)

March 1, 2020

Sec. 567. The department shall submit to the senate and house appropriations subcommittees on the department budget, the senate and house fiscal agencies, the senate and house policy offices, and the state budget office by March 1 of the current fiscal year a report on completion of medical passports for children in foster care, including the following:

- (a) From the total medical passports transferred, the percentage that transferred within 2 weeks from the date of placement or return to the home.***
- (b) From the total school records, the percentage that transferred within 2 weeks from the date of placement or return to the home.***
- (c) The implementation steps that have been taken to improve the outcomes for the measures in subdivisions (a).***



Section 567 PA 67 of 2019

The Michigan Department of Health and Human Services (MDHHS) tracks the transfer of medical passports to parents and caregivers of children in foster care. The transfer of the medical passport within two weeks of placement change is measured through Michigan Statewide Automated Child Welfare Information System (MiSACWIS) data.

The following is a summary of the data obtained from MiSACWIS for FY 2019:

Implementation Steps Taken to Improve Outcomes

The MDHHS Child Welfare Medical Unit provides child welfare staff ongoing policy assistance and training regarding the medical passport.

Education Record Transfer

Foster care education policy requires educational records contained in the child's case file be provided to a caregiver or parent within two weeks of placement, replacement, or reunification.

The following is a summary of the data that was pulled from MiSACWIS for FY 2019:
