

Michigan Statewide Automated Child Welfare Information System Transition to the Comprehensive Child Welfare Information System

(FY 2020 Appropriation Act - Public Act 67 of 2019)

July 1, 2020

Sec. 1906. (1) The workgroup, in collaboration with the Michigan Federation of Children and Families and the Association of Accredited Child and Family Agencies, shall issue a report to the house and senate appropriations subcommittees on the department budget, the house and senate fiscal agencies, the house and senate policy offices, and the state budget office no later than November 1, January 1, March 1, May 1, July 1, and September 1 of the current fiscal year that must consist of, but is not limited to, the following:

- a) Recommendations for the future funding and operations of MiSACWIS and the replacement state child welfare information system.***
- b) Recommendations for any remedial actions that the workgroup considers necessary for the department to implement in order to improve the functions of MiSACWIS and the subsequent state child welfare information system, and measures established to determine the success of MiSACWIS and the replacement state child welfare information system.***
- c) Any other information the workgroup would like to provide regarding MiSACWIS and the replacement state child welfare information system.***

(2) As used in this section, "workgroup" means the workgroup established by the department to facilitate the transition from the use of MiSACWIS to a replacement state child welfare information system, according to the independent assessment of Michigan's statewide automated child welfare information system and child welfare data reporting infrastructure submitted to the United States District Court for the Eastern District of Michigan on February 25, 2019.

The Michigan Department of Health and Human Services' Children's Services Agency continues preparations for the transition to a comprehensive child welfare information system (CCWIS).

Recommendations for the future funding and operations of Michigan Statewide Automated Child Welfare Information (MiSACWIS) and the replacement state child welfare information system:

The department was pursuing the incremental, modular replacement of MiSACWIS. The current COVID-19 pandemic has resulted in the elimination of CCWIS FY20 funding, which has impacted the transition to CCWIS plan. The department will continue to prepare for CCWIS transition until funding becomes available.

Recommendations for remedial actions to improve MiSACWIS functionality and CCWIS, and measures established to determine the success of MiSACWIS and CCWIS:

Minor modifications continue to be made to MiSACWIS to improve usability and address key user needs. The focus, in addition to the state or federal mandated changes, remains on usability, data quality, and fixes that result in overall efficiencies and reduction of costs. System modifications to support improved data quality are also critical. Tasks addressing data clean-up continue to be prioritized to improve current functions. Measures to determine success of MiSACWIS and the new CCWIS have not been finalized but remain in progress.

Any other information the workgroup would like to provide regarding MiSACWIS and the replacement state child welfare information system.

Establishing the CCWIS Transition Workgroup meetings has been hampered by the COVID-19 crisis, however, efforts to finalize the participants and establish a timeframe for an initial kick-off will continue. Communication regarding the workgroup logistics is in progress with private agency partners. Close communication with the Administration for Children and Families on CCWIS planning continues.
